


Why Flooding Can Be Dangerous:

- Power lines may have been knocked down during a storm. Don't touch the power lines because they may still have electricity and could hurt you.
- Insects, especially mosquitoes, like ponds of water. When you are near the floodwater, they could bite you.
- Animals may have gotten lost or carried away during the flood. These animals could be dangerous. If you see dead animals, do not touch them.
- Floodwater is full of germs that can make you sick or cause infections. Disinfect anything that touched floodwater and wash your hands a lot.
- Floodwater can carry large objects with it. Don't go into floodwater to pick items up. Some objects could be sharp or dangerous.
- The water may be deeper than you think, so don't play in any puddles or streams. Flooding can also cause cracks and holes in the ground.
- Moving water is dangerous. Just six inches of water can knock you off your feet.
- A storm or flood can break gas lines, causing a gas leak near your house. Tell an adult immediately if you smell gas around your house.
